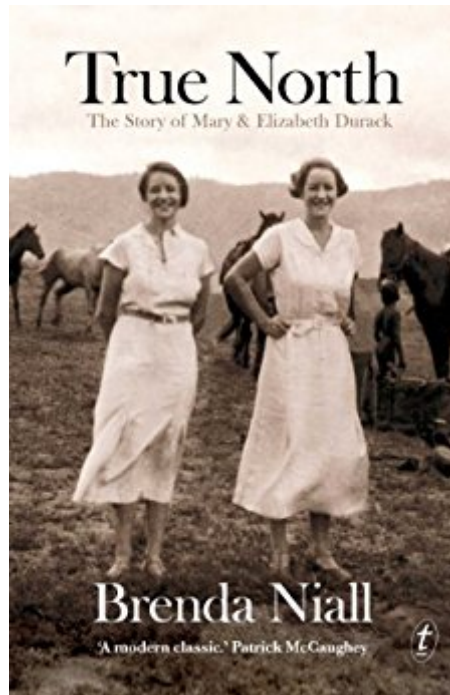

True North: The Story Of Mary And Elizabeth Durack



Synopsis

A year spent together on the stations in their early twenties ignited in the sisters a lifelong love of the Kimberley, along with a growing unease about the situation of the Aboriginal people employed there. Through war, love affairs, children and eventual old age, the Duracks continued to write and paint - their closely intertwined creative lives always shaped by the enduring power of the Kimberley region. With unprecedented access to hundreds of private family letters, unpublished memoirs, diaries and family papers, Brenda Niall gets to the heart of a uniquely Australian story that spans the twentieth century. An interesting book about this historically important Western Australian family. The writing is a bit tedious and goes over the same ground many times but it is a good record of such a diverse and resourceful family.

The writing is clear but there was very little analysis of the characters of Mary and Elizabeth. Much of the history could have been found by reading Mary's "Kings in Grass Castles". I expected a more searching examination of their obviously privileged position in society. For instance their opportunity to take off up North leaving young children with the Loreto nuns was hardly something other lesser mortals would have had the opportunity to do! Their attitudes to marriage were not typical of the era or of their religious upbringing but Niall has glided over this implying that any fault lay with their husbands.

Great read about the love affair both Mary and Elizabeth Durack had with the Outback. How their

experiences and their struggle for survival culminated in their creative expressions.

More informative than entertaining, enjoyed the Durack family dynamics and the effect the NT had on the output of the two sisters.
