

What a marvelous and glorious way to die! As soon as I read this, I knew I had to read more about the lives and mission of these brave and courageous men. BTW, it is related in the book that the reason Goupil was struck three times in the back of the head with a hatchet is because earlier that day he had made the sin of the cross.
